



## BRIEF OVERVIEW AND RELEVANCE

UXO Site 6 is a 692-acre area within former Camp Elliott, which was used as a military training range and is currently home to approximately 9,200 military families. The former Camp Elliott was used as a tank, antitank, and artillery-training practice range from World War I to the Korean War by the Army, Navy, and Marine Corps. The Murphy Canyon Naval Housing (MCNH) Record of Decision (ROD) established LUC with Long Term Monitoring as the remedy to protect the public from encountering UXO on the site. In addition to housing, the site includes open space, schools, recreational centers with pools and athletic fields, a chapel, housing offices, and commercial facilities. Jacobs is supporting the site remedy, including public outreach activities and periodic site monitoring and inspections.

### CHALLENGES

The team was challenged with conducting staff awareness training and public outreach activities remotely due to in-person restrictions associated with the COVID-19 pandemic.

### KEY ACCOMPLISHMENT

Implemented innovative public outreach solutions to overcome in-person COVID-19 restrictions, including conducting live video trainings, preparing give-away packets delivered to schools for drive-by pickup events, and preparing and delivering information fliers for remote distribution.
