#### **Restoration Advisory Board**

- A Restoration Advisory Board is a group of interested local community members who meet with, and provide input to, Navy and state and federal regulatory agency staff a few times per year to discuss environmental cleanup on the installation
- Meetings are open to the public
- Meeting frequency is established by members
- To establish a Restoration Advisory Board, the Navy needs:
  - At least 6 community members committed to fulfilling Restoration Advisory Board responsibilities
  - A variety of people representing diverse interests from the local community

#### What Are Restoration Advisory Board Member Responsibilities?

- Attend meetings a few times per year
- Receive a member-only orientation
- Develop, maintain, and follow a formal Restoration Advisory Board charter
- Provide input from the community to Navy decision-makers
- Review and comment on various technical documents and related area information
- Serve as a liaison with the community and provide them with information discussed at the Restoration Advisory Board meetings
